Interesting Facts about Pi

- March 14th is also Albert Einstein's birthday!
- **How many digits are in pi?** Pi is infinite, meaning it never ends. Pi is an irrational number.
- Pi is completely random, which means there are no patterns, making it extremely difficult to memorize.
- So far the record calculated for Pi is 206,158,430,000 digits by a supercomputer in Tokyo. 3.14 is just the beginning.
- **Where did the symbol come from?** π is a Greek letter pronounced like the English letter "p", and means perimeter.
- Pi is the 16th number in the Greek alphabet.
- The official celebration of pi day starts at 1:59 to represent 3.14159.
- Pi has been studied by humans for almost 4000 years.
- The current pi champion memorized 42,195 digits in 1995.
- Pi was first intensely studied by one of the greatest mathematicians of the ancient world, Archimedes of Syracuse. Archimedes was so engrossed in his work that he did not notice that Rome had taken Syracuse. When a Roman soldier approached him, he yelled in Greek "Do not touch my circles!" The Roman soldier simply cut off his head and went on his business.

On 28th March 2022, the **World Pi Day** event was organized and observed virtually by the Faculty and students of The ICFAI Education School. They chose Zoom meeting as a venue. Firstly, an inaugural session took place with an introduction of the mathematical constant *Pi* followed by its significance in our life. The students were excited to hear more about *Pi*.


A question-answer session on *Pi* took place among the hosts where very genuine, curious and relevant questions were asked by one and replied by the other making it informative and interesting.





The event overall was successful in answering many questions and giving a fresh and enlightened perspective towards education.



